Title I

What is it? The Parent and Family Engagement Plan describes how Annette Winn Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Throughout the school year, parents are also asked to complete comment cards as well as workshop evaluations. Our parents are given many opportunities to give input for the Parent and Family Engagement Plan.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in our Parent and Family Engagement Plan. Annette Winn Elementary will provide full opportunities for the participation of families with limited English, families with disabilities and families of homeless or migratory children.
